Stewardship is the commitment of one's self to God's Service, recognizing that we do not have the right of control over our property or ourselves. A biblical stewardship synonym is "manager". The qualities of a good steward are:

- They take care of the gifts that God has given them to manage.

- Stewardship over the gospel

So, what will we be held accountable for? We have been made stewards of these things on earth – such as money, tangible things, even people; but the most <u>precious</u> thing we steward, as God's servants, **is his Kingdom!**

<u>200th Anniversary Celebration</u> – As we members of the Wytheville Presbyterian Church prepare to celebrate the 200th anniversary of our church, let us take a look back at our heritage. For the next few months, we will include in the Newsletter a short amount of information about things that brought our church to where it is today.

In the early 1700's Scotch-Irish settlers came to what is now Southwest Virginia and brought their Presbyterian beliefs with them. These settlers came in two streams about the same time. Some came over the mountains from the Virginia colony. These settlers were more formal with their religion and services and believed their ministers needed much formal training. These have been called "Old School Presbyterians". Other Scotch-Irish settlers were slightly more recent migrants and entered America through the port at Philadelphia. They occupied farmland in Pennsylvania and soon overflowed into the valleys and migrated down the valleys to this area. These settlers were more what we think of as "frontiersmen" and were less formal in their services and requirements for their ministers. They have been called the "New School" Presbyterians. Both of these groups established churches in what is now Wytheville and Wythe County and would become important in what would eventually be the Wytheville Presbyterian Church.



200 Years: Honoring the Past; Inspiring the Future

The longest serving pastor at the WPC was the Reverend Dr. Thomas Sproule. He served faithfully from September 30, 1962, until March 25, 1990.

Tom spent his early years in suburban Philadelphia with brothers Joe and Bill, sister, Peggy and a large Scotts Irish family; with summers spent enjoying adventures on Mount Desert Island, Maine. Following high school graduation Tom, always an athlete, entered West Chester State College as a physical education major and accepted a call to serve his country following the bombing of Pearl Harbor. He served from 1941-46 in both the U. S. Navy and Air Force and attained the rank of Captain, serving as a bombardier with the 40th Bomb Group on Tinian, in the South Pacific. Following his military service, he returned to West Chester State College where he was elected Class President, graduating in 1948. He continued his education earning a master's degree in psychology from Temple University and he pursued theological studies at Union Theological Seminary, the University of Pennsylvania, the University of Edinburg (Scotland) and Trinity Theological Seminary from which he earned his doctorate.

Tom was ordained and began his pastorate at the First Presbyterian Church of Asheville, North Caroline, where he met his partner in life and ministry, the lovely Betty Jean Morris. The young family accompanied Tom as he continued his education at University of Edinburg Scotland. In 1962 he accepted a call to the Wytheville Presbyterian Church, where he served as minister until his retirement in 1990. Dr. Sproule was bestowed the title Minister Emeritus and remained an active member of the Church, the Abingdon Presbytery, Synod and General Assembly.

Many remember Rev Sproule through his ministry to young people as an athletic official serving for thirty years as both a high school and college football and basketball official, as an adjunct faculty at Wytheville Community College, as commander of the Civil Air Patrol Cadet Squadron, and as a hurdlers' coach for several generations of GWHS athletes. The Associated Press and International News Service recognized Rev. Sproule for his unique position of serving as a clergyman and athletic official.

Rev Sproule's ministry to the community continued through participation on numerous civic organizations and boards, including Chairman of the Board of Directors of the Wythe County Community Hospital, President of the United Way, President of the Chamber of Commerce, Chairman of the Salvation Army, Chairman of the American Red Cross, Chairman of the Wytheville Public Library Board, Chairman of Maroon's Incorporated, and President of Wytheville Rotary Club where he was recognized a Paul Harris Fellow.

Rev Sproule was recognized for his service to Wytheville and Wythe County receiving the Wytheville Jaycees Distinguished Service Award, Chamber of Commerce Outstanding Citizen Award, Civic Wall of Honor, and the Sports Hall of Fame. To honor a lifetime of service, contributions and dedication, the Town of Wytheville proclaimed Sunday, March 25, 2007, as the Reverend Dr. Thomas Sproule Day in the Town of Wytheville.

Rev Sproule passed away on the morning of October 6, 2010. Following a private grave side service complete with bagpipers, a memorial service and celebration of his life was held on October 8 at the Wytheville Presbyterian Church.
