

MISSION COMMITTEE PROJECT #1:

APPALACHIAN TRAIL MAGIC

Several months ago, the Mission Committee began exploring Trail Magic and the opportunity to provide food and fellowship to hikers passing through Virginia. The more we learned, the more excited we became to join the thousands of individuals, organizations and churches offering Trail Magic to hikers between the Trail's southern terminus at Springer Mountain, Georgia and the northern terminus at Katahdin, Maine (2,190 miles).

In March, we had the opportunity to meet with Mark and Anita Wagner, who live in Wytheville and recently hiked the Trail. Anita hiked 600 miles and Mark completed the entire Trail. They shared many positive experiences with Trail Magic along their journey, including the most desirable food, snacks, and drinks, as well as the fellowship and encouragement they received from Trail Magic "Angels".

According to the Appalachian Trail website. "Trail Magic can take many forms ... but most often when hikers think of trail magic, they think of kind strangers parked at trail crossings with coolers full of beverages and food".

That is exactly what we plan to do!

Here are the details:

WHEN: Wednesday, May 22nd, noon to 4:00 (will reschedule if weather does not permit)

WHERE: Suiter parking lot in Bland County. Watch for more details in Announcements.

WHAT: A large table full of fruits, veggies, cookies, and brownies (homemade and store bought), salty snacks, "trail mix", etc.; coolers full of water, Gatorade, Capri Sun, etc.; some first aid supplies

WHO: members and friends of our church enjoying fellowship with hikers and each other.

MISSION COMMITTEE PROJECT #2:

Once again, this May we will be collecting diapers for children in need. The diapers we collect will be shared with Holy Trinity Lutheran Church for their Drive-Up Diaper Drive ministry which takes place several times each year. As a CarePortal church, we see the need for diapers in our community and we would like to support this ministry through our own diaper collections. Sizes 3, 4, 5, and 6 are in greatest demand. Collection boxes are in the Narthex and Hatcher Hall. Last year we collected 1,186 diapers. Let's challenge ourselves to meet or exceed that goal!

According to franciscanhealth.org, "When families are not able to provide diapers for their children, a child can be impacted physically, mentally, and emotionally. Children who live in homes suffering from diaper insecurity often face constant infections and are often inconsolable due to discomfort. This can lead to child abuse and neglect."
